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## Grand Canyon in Stereo

Complete with 18 albumen silver print stereoviews [8 cm x 15.5 cm] on gray Underwood & Underwood mounts [9 cm x 18 cm] with titles beneath the image and lengthy descriptions on the reverse. 64-page (matching brown cloth) descriptive booklet present. Both the views and booklet are housed in a box and slipcase [19 cm x 12 cm x 5 cm] Title, publisher and bands gilt stamped on the spine of the slipcase. Very good. Textblock is shaken. Minor rubbing to the extremities of the box. Fold-out map [35 cm x 3 cm] of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado laid in at the rear of the booklet. Smaller map shows the locations of the stereoviews.

*The booklet contains a thirty-two-page introduction about the park by C.A. Higgins. This is followed by detailed descriptions of all eighteen views, that is edited by Dellenbaugh.*











This group offers views of both sides of the Continental Divide, with photographs of the Lower, Midway and Upper Geyser Basins (including Old Faithful); the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone; Norris Geyser Basin; north entrance and Mammoth Hot Springs.*



