

Nauvoo Restoration Map with Additions



1- Hill, Gustavus; Sutcliffe Maudsley, and William Weeks. **Map of the City of Nauvoo, Drawn Principally from the Plats of the Original Surveys.** Nauvoo Restoration, Inc., 1965. Map [55.5 cm x 46 cm] / [22" x 18"] on a mount [68.5 cm x 46 cm] / [27" x 18"] Manuscript additions. 50 locations have been marked with small yellow stickers and numbered, there is a legend beneath the map that identifies all of the marked places.

This map was originally printed in 1842. Sutcliffe Maudsley's portrait of 'Lieut. Gen. Joseph Smith is at the lower left corner. William Weeks architectural drawing of the Nauvoo Temple is at the upper Left. Map shows the streets of Nauvoo and locates the Temple, Nauvoo House, Pres. J. Smith's Residence, Printing Office, Brick Store, and a few other prominent residences and locations. Published by Dr. J. LeRoy Kimball's Nauvoo Restoration. Dr. Kimball was an early champion of acquiring historical LDS sites in Nauvoo and putting them back in the care of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"Nauvoo Restoration, Incorporated, is a non-profit corporation sponsored by the Church for the acquisition, preservation, and restoration of part of the old city of Nauvoo, Illinois, where the Saints lived before the westward migration. We hope to provide an authentic physical environment for renewed public interest in Nauvoo. Plans also call for the development of landmarks and other features of historic interest along the Mormon trail and other sites of Church historical interest." - Dr. LeRoy Kimball 'Improvement Era' (July, 1967)



This is the smaller New Wilson Hotel version, of this lovely route map. Captivating map of the Mormon Trail from Nauvoo, Illinois, to the Great Salt Lake, which depicts the physical features of the countryside, the mountains, rivers, waterfalls, trees, etc. Also, wagons and trekkers on the trail, Indian encampments, buffalo, and more.

A truly marvelous depiction of one of the great episodes in American history, produced to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the journey. This detailed image was produced with the aid of Apostle Franklin D. Richards, the church historian, in 1899. Uncommon.

Charles Roscoe Savage (1832-1909) was an accomplished and prolific photographer who lived successfully within his Salt Lake City community and traveled widely throughout the West taking photographs and befriending other important photographers of his day such as Carleton Watkins, Edward Wilson, Timothy O'Sullivan, Alfred Hart and A.J. Russell. Savage took several of the West's most famous images at the celebration of the joining of the transcontinental railroads at Promontory Point, Utah in 1869. Savage also took the first photographs of what became Zion National Park.




This is the rare account by Brigham Young on his initial trip to the Great Basin. This is the Herbert Auerbach copy and an image of this work appears on page [247] in the Parke-Bernet auction catalog for the legendary Auerbach sale.

"General Epistle from the Council of the Twelve Apostles marks the beginning of Mormonism's Utah period. Issued fifty-three days after Brigham Young and most of the Twelve returned to Winter Quarters following their trek to the Great Salt Lake Valley." - Crawley 346. Flake/Draper 1507. The University of Deseret intended to publish the Book of Mormon in three separate parts for the use of school children and incoming immigrants. Only part one was ever printed.

"[Brigham] Young therefore directed George D. Watt, an Englishman, and an early Mormon convert, to create a new alphabet based on English language phonic values. Watt may have been Young's personal secretary. What is certain is that he was an expert in the then-new and very popular Pitman system of shorthand. The alphabet assignment was handed to Watt in 1853, and by the following year he was able to lay before Young a 32 - character system (eventually increased to 38)" - Wentz, Roby



View of the Temple Block with the Brigham Young Monument on the Temple grounds just south of the Salt Lake Temple.




Nicer than usually seen copy of this major work of scholarship (and by most accounts Arrington's most important work) by the celebrated and influential historian of the west and Mormon country, who's legacy can't be understated, and who cast a long shadow.

According to Saunders: "Though certainly not the first of its kind, in the realm of modern scholarly studies on Mormonism this work ranks unquestionably as the broadest and probably the single most important. 



John D. Lee was the only person ever convicted of the atrocities at Mountain Meadows (nearly two decades after the event) and executed just a few months before the death of his adopted father, Brigham Young. Important work edited by Brooks and Cleland that covers the time before Lee's arrival in the Great Basin up to his arrest in 1876 for the Mountain Meadows Massacre.

"These two volumes contain five hitherto unpublished diaries of John D. Lee, 'one of the most tragic, controversial, and enigmatic figures in the history of the West.' The second adopted son of Brigham Young, Lee participated as an important leader in the historic Mormon migration of





"In the summer of 2009 hundreds of members of the Fundamentalist Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints (FLDS) congregated at the City and County Building in Salt Lake City, Utah to protest the sale of land they believe to be holy. Many of them had come from Colorado City in Southern Utah. Others were from Nevada and Arizona. The FLDS land was taken over by the court in 2005 due to allegations that convicted FLDS leader Warren Jeffs had mismanaged it." - from the title sheet.

Poster for the Trent Harris cinematic classic, Plan 10 from Outer Space. The film tells the story of Lucinda [Stefane Russell] who discovers a mysterious plaque on the shores of the Great Salt Lake (that was destroyed a century earlier by 'Talmage.') The discovery of the plaque leads her to discover an insidious alien plot for world domination documented by a disreputable early Mormon prophet.

"Lucinda Hall discovers a century old book penned by a mad Mormon prophet. She deciphers this odd artifact and is sucked into a world where spacemen, polygamists, and angels run amuck. Is she nuts or has she uncovered a diabolical plot to change the world led by Nehor (Karen Black), a peeved alien from the planet Kolob."
